Assemblies 2018- 2019

At Knowles Primary School, key stage assemblies have been developed to encourage all children, irrespective of their faith or culture, to reflect upon our school values by which we conduct ourselves every day. Assemblies take place each week on designated mornings and are designed around themes with messages and key words, which are followed up in class discussions and during timetabled subject lessons. Our assemblies provide opportunities for teachers and children to discuss subjects that have an impact on behaviour, safeguarding, wellbeing and tolerance in line with supporting pupils spiritual, moral, social and cultural development. Assemblies are also used to embed the teaching of British Values. All acts of collective worship aim to create nurture and sustain a sense of community.

Throughout the year we hold festival assemblies; Harvest and Christmas which are all enthusiastically attended by parents and friends. Other faith assemblies; Hanukkah, Chinese New year, Holi, Easter etc... are led by visitors or staff members. All half-termly themes follow our PSHE scheme of work. Class assemblies reflect both values and learning that has taken place

'Kaleidoscope inspired' sessions start the day which include a time for reflection and promotes school values. These sessions are key to the school's ethos and allow children time to reflect on their own values and the behaviours associated with those values.
