In school, every class displays a behaviour ladder; with the colours green, yellow and orange. All children begin the day on green as this is the expected behaviour. Children not following our school values will be warned and if behaviour continues, they will be moved down the ladder. All children have the opportunity to move back up to green. Children's behaviour is dealt with that day and every child starts the day on green.

Children who consistently fail to uphold the school values and where behaviour is more extreme children will be put on individual behaviour plans (depending on severity) with report cards, seclusion or possible exclusion.

Displaying the school's values.

5 minutes time out to talk with the class teacher or adult in the class (e.g. break time, lunchtime, end of day)
Time to build relations
Time to investigate any underlying reasons for behaviour
Time to discuss strategies to get back to green

Time out with the class teacher or adult in the class (e.g. break time, lunchtime, end of day)
Missed learning managed within classroom
Parents informed via a phone call home or through a face to face meeting at the end of the day
